Dust of Snow – About the Author

Robert Frost was a famous American poet. He was born in San Francisco on March 26, 1874. His father belonged to New England, and his mother was a Scottish immigrant from Edinburgh. By the 1920s, Frost was the most celebrated poet in America. His poetical works 'A Boy's Will' (1913), 'North of Boston' (1914), 'New Hampshire' (1923), 'A Further Range' (1936) 'Steeple Bush' (1947) and 'In the Clearing' (1962) increased his fame and honor. The poem 'Dust of Snow' was published in 'New Hampshire' in 1923. This collection gave him the Pulitzer Prize.

Short Summary of Dust of Snow

'Dust of Snow' is a small poem written by the famous American poet, Robert Frost. The poem is set on a wintry day. In the first stanza, the poet describes a simple natural happening. The snow is falling heavily. The snowy flakes have covered the top of the trees. The poet is standing under a hemlock tree. The movement and alighting of a crow on that tree, make the dust of snowfall on the poet. The crow, a symbol of ill omen and the hemlock tree, associated with a person, is not auspicious things.

However, in the second stanza, the falling of snowflakes and the scene leave a tremendous effect on the mental state and mood of the poet. So far, the day has been quite gloomy and wastage for him. But this ordinary natural happening suddenly brings the desired change in his mood. It gladdens his heart. He realises that the falling of snowflakes on him has saved the day. Now he has no regret as the whole of the day has not gone waste. The moments of the snowfall and their effect have saved the day. They have brought a change in his mood and gladdened and uplifted his spirits.

Summary of Dust of Snow in English

It is winter season and the poet is in a bad mood sitting quietly under the hemlock tree covered all over the snow. On spur of moment, a crow sitting on the branch of the tree shakes the tree, and the snow from tree falls on the poet. The snow is cold and velvety to touch which changes the poet's mood from bitter to elate. This fills him with a refreshing feeling. This moment was very compelling and saves his day from disappointment. The black crow usually symbolizes bad omen and emblem of death and fear. Since the crow is not

related to goodwill, it is ironic that during this poem he did an honest deed by shaking off the snow.

Robert Frost did not prefer to use any other trees like oak, maple or pine. He chose the hemlock which is typically related to poison and toxicity. Similarly, he uses dust which is useless to anybody and nobody wants to be liking dust. But the poet uses it as an impulse that brings positive thoughts in mind. Anyway, the alluring snow that adorns the poisonous hemlock tree's branches is shaken off by a scary crow. We have toxic hemlock covered in pure, white snow, and a person who is depressed, getting to kill himself and walking under the tree. The black crow throws the snow on the poet. The feels of pure cold snow alter his mind about sacrificing his life. On the contrary, he decides to forget the regrets of his life and sorrow to follow the path of healing of the inner soul.

This poem conveys the message that nothing in life is small. Even trivial things can bring positive changes in our life. In addition to this, it also shows that if we take things positively in life, situations do change for better. Even the small help or good gestures we do for others make large differences. Just believe those random acts of kindness we do and the way they brighten a person's day, and sometimes change their future. Noticing and appreciating all the tiny things in life will make our life happier.

Conclusion of Dust of Snow

The poem teaches us a lesson that every small act in life can illuminate our soul and motivate us to do better.

Summary of Dust of Snow in Hindi

यह सर्दियों का मौसम है और कवि बर्फ में ढके हुए हेमलॉक पेड़ के नीचे चुपचाप बैठा रहता है। पल भर के लिए, पेड़ की शाखा पर बैठा एक कौआ पेड़ को हिला देता है, और पेड़ से बर्फ कवि पर गिरती है। बर्फ ठंडी और मखमली होती है, जो कवि के मूड को कड़वे से बदलकर बदल देती है। यह उसे एक ताज़ा एहसास से भर देता है। यह क्षण बहुत सम्मोहक था और निराशा से अपने दिन को बचाता है। काली कौआ आमतौर पर मृत्यु और भय के बुरे शगुन और प्रतीक का प्रतीक है। चूंकि कौआ सद्भावना से संबंधित नहीं है, यह विडंबना है कि इस कविता के दौरान उसने बर्फ से किनारा करके एक ईमानदार काम किया।

रॉबर्ट फ्रॉस्ट ओक, मेपल या पाइन जैसे किसी भी अन्य पेड़ का उपयोग करना पसंद नहीं करते थे। उन्होंने हेमलॉक को चुना जो आमतौर पर जहर और विषाक्तता से संबंधित है। इसी तरह, वह धूल का उपयोग करता है जो किसी के लिए बेकार है और कोई भी धूल पसंद नहीं करना चाहता है। लेकिन कवि इसे एक आवेग के रूप में उपयोग करता है जो मन में सकारात्मक विचार लाता है। वैसे भी, जहरीली हेमलॉक पेड़ों की शाखाओं को आकर्षित करने वाली आकर्षक बर्फ एक डरावने कौए द्वारा हिल गई है। हमारे पास शुद्ध, सफेद बर्फ में ढंका हुआ विषैला हेमलॉक है, और एक व्यक्ति जो उदास है, खुद को मारने और पेड़ के नीचे चलने के लिए। काला कौआ कवि पर बर्फ फेंकता है। शुद्ध ठंडी बर्फ का अहसास उसके जीवन का बलिदान करने के बारे में उसके

दिमाग को बदल देता है। इसके विपरीत, वह अपने जीवन के पछतावे को भूलने का फैसला करता है और आंतरिक आत्मा के उपचार के मार्ग का पालन करने के लिए दुःख करता है।

यह कविता संदेश देती है कि जीवन में कुछ भी छोटा नहीं है। यहां तक कि तुच्छ चीजें हमारे जीवन में सकारात्मक बदलाव ला सकती हैं। इसके अतिरिक्त, यह यह भी दर्शाता है कि यदि हम जीवन में चीजों को सकारात्मक रूप से लेते हैं, तो स्थिति बेहतर के लिए बदल जाती है। यहां तक कि छोटी मदद या अच्छे इशारे जो हम दूसरों के लिए करते हैं, वे बड़े अंतर लाते हैं। बस उन दयालु कृत्यों पर विश्वास करें जो हम करते हैं और जिस तरह से वे किसी व्यक्ति के दिन को रोशन करते हैं, और कभी-कभी उनके भविष्य को बदलते हैं। जीवन की सभी छोटी-छोटी चीजों को देखना और उनकी सराहना करना हमारे जीवन को खुशहाल बना देगा।
